

Road FAQ's

How do I report a non-working street light?

Call PSE&G at 1-800-436-7734.

I think the drain in front of my house is blocked. What should I do?

Contact us, and someone will be dispatched to check out the problem.

The snow plow knocked over my mailbox. What can be done about it?

During snow removal operations mailboxes are sometimes victims. If this happens to you, it was not intentional. Call the Department and someone will investigate.

I saw a pothole in the road. Can it be fixed?

Call the Public Works Department and we will let you know if the pot hole is on a Township Street. If so, we will repair it. If it is a County or State road we will report it to the appropriate government agency for repair.

I have noticed a sign which is missing or in need of repair. What should I do?

Contact the Public Works Dept.

I noticed litter along a roadway in the Township. What should I do about it?

If you are willing to clean up any area publically owned area of the Township, the Recycling Division can supply you with bags and gloves to get the job done. If you cannot do the work yourself, call the Recycling Division and every effort will be made to clean up the area in a timely manner using New Jersey Clean Community funds.

I have noticed a private contractor working on my street or in my neighborhood and I have a question or concern. Who do I call?

Call the Engineering Department at extension 7225.

I just moved into a newly constructed home. I have a concern about the street or roadway in front of my house or in my neighborhood. Who should I call?

The Township will not accept maintenance responsibility of new developments' streets until the bond is released. This guarantees that the builder has constructed the streets and roadways in the proper approved manner. Any problems with streets still under the Developer's control should be directed to the Engineering Department at extension 7225. They will be able to speak with the builder about the problem and have it corrected.

I live in a new development and my street has not been plowed. Why?

It is possible that the street does not belong to the Township. The Township does not plow streets until the bond posted by the developer is released and a resolution is passed transferring maintenance responsibility to the Township. The builder is responsible for snow removal until this happens. Call the Township if you are not sure if the streets have been accepted. The Engineering Department controls the developer's activity.
