People who don’t call often say they did not want to bother the police. We need your assistance and seek your phone calls – it is never a bother. Another explanation for not calling is they were unsure of what they were witnessing. Here is the rule to follow when deciding if to call. If what you are seeing or hearing caused you to stop and take notice, then call. Call us if there is an unusual vehicle in your neighborhood, a person walking through yards, someone knocking on your door, or anything else that you think we need to look into. We are committed to serving you the members of the South Brunswick community.

We take pride in our efforts to deter crime. We also want our citizens to realize that we work hard to keep our crime rates some of the lowest in the area. The 44,000 eyes and ears of our residents will make a difference in keeping our community safe. We work best when we work together.
