SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP TO HONOR LOCAL VETERANS THROUGH STREET SIGN DEDICATIONS THIS FALL

SOUTH BRUNSWICK, NJ (August 25) – The Township of South Brunswick will continue to recognize local veterans for their service through the Veterans Recognition Street Naming Initiative this fall. The Township's Veteran Street Sign Program allows residents who were Wartime Veterans to be honored by adding their name on a secondary street sign to an existing municipal road.

By adding names of local Wartime Veterans to public street signs, the Township seeks to promote public awareness of these individuals while showing appreciation for their outstanding contributions and service to our Country as members of the United States Armed Forces.

Eligible candidates for this honor include honorably discharged Veterans having served in the Military Departments as defined under the Department of Defense, which include the Departments of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard. Wartime Veterans are individuals who served in the active military forces during a period of armed conflict or who received the armed forces expeditionary or other campaign service medals during an emergency condition, including those who died in the line of duty in the active military forces.

This fall, the following dedications will be held, all beginning at 11:00AM:

- **Alex and Alexander John Kish** – September 6, 2025, at the intersection of Georges Road and Stanley Avenue.
- **Philip Joseph O'Brien** – September 20, 2025, at the intersection of Cambridge Road and Palmer Road.
- **Louis E. Pietrefesa** – October 4, 2025, at the intersection of Georges Road and Sarah Court.
- **Charles G. Weber Sr.** – October 18, 2025, at the intersection of Ridge Road and Welcome Farms Road.
- **Lt. John W. Farnkopf** – November 8, 2025, at the intersection of Major Road and Northumberland Way.

South Brunswick Township invites residents to join in honoring these veterans at the upcoming ceremonies.
