SOUTH BRUNSWICK SHARES ADDITIONAL PROPERTY TAX RELIEF INFORMATION: NJ PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAM

SOUTH BRUNSWICK, NJ (OCTOBER 16). Following Mayor Charles Carley's recent letter to residents about the *StayNJ* and *ANCHOR* property tax relief programs, the Township is also reminding eligible homeowners about the **NJ Property Tax Relief Program** (formerly known as the *Senior Freeze Program*), another important initiative designed to help New Jersey seniors and disabled residents remain in their homes.

The **NJ Property Tax Relief Program** reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled homeowners for property tax increases on their principal residence. Once approved, participants' property tax amounts are "frozen" at their current level—meaning any future property tax increases are reimbursed by the State of New Jersey.

Eligibility requirements include:

- You must be 65 years of age or older, or receiving federal Social Security disability benefits.
- You must have lived in New Jersey for at least 10 years and owned and lived in your current home for at least the last 3 years.
- You must meet **income limits** established annually by the State.
- Property taxes must be paid in full each year before reimbursement can be issued.

Residents who qualify will receive a reimbursement covering the difference between the current year's property taxes and the amount paid in their first year of eligibility.

Applications for the 2024 tax year (filed in 2025) must be submitted by October 31, 2025.
