SOUTH BRUNSWICK SALUTES WWII VETERAN AND COMMUNITY LEADER CHARLES G. WEBER SR.

SOUTH BRUNSWICK, NJ (OCTOBER 20). The Township of South Brunswick proudly dedicated a Veteran Street Sign in recognition of **Charles G. Weber Sr.**, honoring his service to the United States Army during **World War II** and his lifelong commitment to the South Brunswick community.

The **Veteran Street Dedication Ceremony** was held on **Saturday, October 18, 2025, at 11:00 a.m.** on **Ridge Road**, where family, friends, and Township leaders gathered to celebrate Weber's remarkable life and legacy of service.

Representing the Township were **Mayor Charlie Carley**, **Deputy Mayor Ken Bierman**, **Councilwoman Ann Grover**, **Councilwoman Patty Germain**, and **Township Manager Bryan Bidlack**.

Born in 1925 in the Deans section of South Brunswick, Charles G. Weber Sr. remained a lifelong resident of the Township. He enlisted in the United States Army on October 15, 1943, in Jamesburg, New Jersey, serving in the Coast Artillery branch and assigned to the 23rd Headquarters Battery. During his service, Weber held the rank of Private and was later promoted to Corporal on October 6, 1944.

From July 20, 1945, to February 28, 1946, Weber served overseas in Attu, Aleutian Islands, contributing to the defense and mission of the United States during a critical time in history. He proudly wore the Eastern Defense Command patch, Army Alaska WWII patch, and Flaming Sword WWII patch, each symbolizing his dedication and participation in key operations.

He was **honorably discharged** on **March 20, 1946**, and received the **Aleutian Islands Campaign Medal** and the **Good Conduct Medal** in recognition of his exemplary service.

Beyond his military accomplishments, Weber was deeply committed to his hometown. He owned and operated **Weber's TV and Appliance**, a family business originally established by his father and grandfather as a gunsmith and watch repair shop. A devoted community member, Weber volunteered for many years with the **Monmouth Junction Volunteer Fire Department**, where he served for **59 years**, including **3 years** as **Fire Chief**. He was also an active member of the **Lions Club**, dedicating his time to local fundraisers such as the **Pancake Breakfasts** and **the Circus**.

Weber's legacy of service continues through his family—his late son, **Charles G. Weber Jr.**, and his son **Donald Weber**, who are both life members of the Monmouth Junction Volunteer Fire Department. Donald is celebrating **50 years of volunteer service** this year, continuing the family's longstanding commitment to the community.
